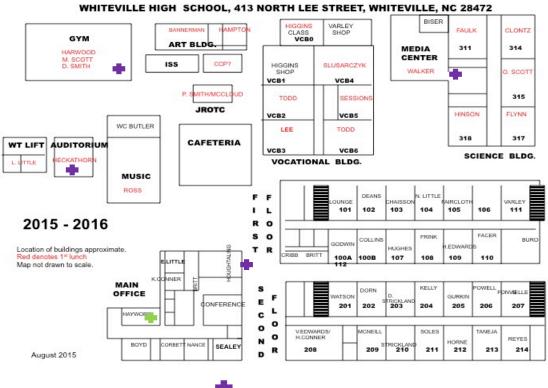

Teacher Expectations 2015-2016 School Year

This document highlights many overlooked areas concerning WCS Board Policy and general day –to- day operations and procedures.

3000 Series WCS School Board Policy (Educational Programs)

- <u>Daily Lesson plans should be accessible to the school principal at any time</u> <u>during the school day via Edmodo</u>. All lesson plans must be submitted each week by 5:00 pm each Sunday. In the event the teacher is absent, the substitute shall be provided a copy of the lesson plan.
- When developing lesson plans utilize the lesson plan rubric provided by the Principal.
- Each teacher is responsible for ensuring **optimal** use of instructional time in his or her classes.
- All employees must use the school system network when communicating
 with students about any school related matters. Employees may not use
 personal websites or online networking profiles (social media) to post
 information in an attempt to communicate with students about school
 related matters.
- Employees are to maintain an appropriate relationship with students at all times, with concerns to personal websites. Employees are encouraged to block students from viewing personal information on employee personal websites or on-line networking profiles in order to prevent the possibility that students could view materials that are not age-appropriate. If an employee creates and/or posts inappropriate content on a website or profile and it has a negative impact on the employee's ability to perform his or her job as it relates to working with students, the employee will be subject to discipline up to and including dismissal.
- A school trip occurs when a student or group of students leaves a school campus under the sponsorship of the school and under the supervision of school employees to extend the educational experiences of that student or group.
- The principal must approve all school trips in advance. School trips that involve travel out of state and/or an overnight stay must also receive prior approval from the superintendent or designee.
- All students who participate in a school trip must provide signed parental
 consent forms to participate, unless a student is officially emancipated, in
 which case the student can consent on his or her own behalf.
- All chaperones and volunteers accompanying students on school trips must be on the approved volunteer list.

- For additional school trip information please review School Trips Regulations WCS Board policy 3320-R.
- In grading students, the following standards will apply:
 - o Academic grades **should not** be based on student attitude or conduct;
 - In averaging grades, the next highest whole number should be given to the student when the grade is one-half or more;
 - The principal has the right to change a grade if he/she believes that the grade provided does not accurately reflect the student's work, but should not do so without conferring with the teacher except in the most extenuating circumstances.
- No later than the end of the first quarter or after the teacher has had up to nine weeks of instructional time with a student, a personal education plan (PEP/s) with focused intervention and performance benchmarks for academic improvement must be developed or updated for each student at risk of academic failure who is not performing at least at grade level.

4000 Series WCS School Board Policy (Students)

- The relationship between staff and students should be one of cooperation, understanding and mutual respect.
- All employees are prohibited from dating, courting or entering into a romantic or sexual relationship with any student enrolled in the school system regardless of the student's age.
- Except in the most extreme circumstances, custody of a student shall not be relinquished to any person without the prior approval of the parent or guardian who has physical custody of the student.
- No student shall be asked to or made to leave the school grounds during school hours to perform errands or deliver messages for any employee.
- Any school employee who knows or has cause to suspect child abuse, neglect, dependency or death as a result of maltreatment is legally required to report the case of the child to the director of social services for Columbus County. The employee also shall immediately report the case to the principal.
- Any student-athlete who is exhibiting signs or symptoms consistent with a concussion must be removed from athletic activity immediately. Further, the student-athlete must not be allowed to return to play or practice that day or on any subsequent day until he or she has been evaluated and has received written clearance for participation that complies with the requirements of G.S. 115C-12(23) and any other applicable law or State Board policy.

7000 Series WCS School Board Policy (Personnel)

- Arrive at school at 7:35 a.m.
- Workday ends at 3:05 p.m. or after all duties and responsibilities are completed.
- Teacher workdays 8:00 a.m. 3:30 p.m.
- Do not leave campus unless the Principal or his designee has granted permission. Once approved, the staff member must sign out in the main office and sign back in upon return.
- The board prohibits employees from engaging in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of any narcotic drug, hallucinogenic drug, amphetamine, barbiturate, marijuana, anabolic steroid, alcohol, stimulants, synthetic cannabinoids, counterfeit substance, or any other controlled substance as defined in (1) schedules I through VI of the North Carolina Controlled Substances Act or in (2) schedules I through V of section 202 of the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 812) and further defined by regulation at 21 C.F.R. 1300.01 through 1300.04 and 21 C.F.R. 1308.11 through 1308.15.
- The Drug-Free and Alcohol-Free Workplace policy governs each employee before, during, and after school hours while the employee is on any property owned or leased by the board of education; at any time during which the employee is acting in the course and scope of his or her employment with the board of education; and at any time that the employee's violation of this policy has a direct and adverse effect upon his or her job performance.

• All school employees shall:

- Be familiar with, support, comply with and, when appropriate, enforce board policies, administrative procedures, school rules and applicable laws:
- Attend to the safety and welfare of students, including the need to provide appropriate supervision of students;
- Demonstrate integrity, respect and commitment to the truth through attitudes, behavior and communications with others;
- Address or appropriately direct any complaints concerning school employees, the school program or school operations; and
- O Support and encourage good school-community relations in all interactions with students, parents and members of the community.

- Employees shall notify the superintendent if they are arrested for, charged with or convicted of a criminal offense (including entering a plea of guilty or nolo contendere) other than a minor traffic violation (i.e., speeding, parking or a lesser violation). Notice must be in writing, must include all pertinent facts and must be delivered to the superintendent no later than the next scheduled business day following the arrest, charge or conviction, unless the employee is hospitalized or incarcerated, in which case the employee must report the alleged violation within 24 hours after his or her release.
- Employees are responsible for the content on their social media sites, including content added by the employee, the employee's friends or members of the public who can access the employee's site, and for Web links on the employee's site.
- Instructional Personnel are considered professional employees and should
 dress in a neat and professional manner appropriate to the standards of their
 profession and school. Men should wear appropriate pants with shirts and
 ties, shirts with collars, and/or sweaters. Women should wear dresses or
 appropriate tops with skirts or slacks.
- An employee's dress or appearance may not be so unusual, inappropriate or lacking in neatness and cleanliness that it clearly disrupts class or learning activities. <u>The following attire is considered inappropriate for school</u> <u>employees:</u>
 - o Jewelry affixed to an employee's nose, tongue, cheek, lip, or eyebrow;
 - Clothing which is disruptive, provocative, revealing, indecent, vulgar, or obscene to which the following guidelines apply:
 - Skirts or dresses may be no higher than three (3) inches above the top of the knee
 - Low necklines, bare midriffs, spaghetti straps, camisole tops, and overly tight clothing are not appropriate dress for school employees;
 - Clothing which promotes alcoholic beverages, tobacco, or the use of controlled substances by words or symbols, or is of a disruptive nature;
 - Clothing or body art that contains profanity, nudity, depicts violence or is sexual in nature by words or symbols;
 - o Rubber flip flops;
 - Undergarments worn as an outer garment or any see-through clothing;
 - o Hats, sweatbands, bandannas, or sunglasses inside school buildings;
